Grant Cycle Opens: May 1, 2024

Grant Application Deadline: June 7, 2024

Funding Announcement: 2024 Prevention Grant Cycle

Funding Available: A total of \$75,000 is available to fund programs aimed at preventing and/or reducing drug abuse and/or crime in Blair County.

Eligible Applicants: 501(c)(3) Non-profit organizations, schools, and government agencies. Previous grant recipients are also eligible to apply.

There are two grant applications to choose from:

- Funding requests under \$3,000 or
- Funding requests over \$3,000

Grant Application: Visit www.OperationOurTown.org go to the "Grants" tab on the homepage, click on "Apply Now" in the drop-down menu to download the grant application.

> Please note that both grant applications have been revised and updated, so the updated versions (with the revised date of 4/27/2021 in the bottom right corner) must be used to apply for funding ***

Due Date: One (1) original and ten (10) copies of applications must be delivered or mailed to Operation Our Town (5508 6th Avenue, rear Altoona, PA 16602) by June 7, 2024. Any applications that are mailed must be postmarked by this date.

Grant Application Notification: Applicants will be notified of funding decisions by the middle of August.

Grant Recipient Highlight: Northern Blair County Recreation Commission Sponsored Youth Program

The NBCRC's Sponsored Youth Program affords opportunities to two- to twelve-year-olds, whose families otherwise would not be able to afford programming, providing a diverse range of activities. Since their facilities offer both indoor and outdoor activities, youth are able to explore and grow with one another year-round in some way, shape, or form. Whether playing outside on the soccer field or inside on the basketball court, there is a sense of camaraderie shared by all.

Logistically speaking, in order to cover the cost of each program, there is typically a fee to participate, averaging around \$55 per program. Through grant funding from Operation Our Town, however, this fee is able to be covered for youth who otherwise would not be able to participate in programming. Central to the program's mission is providing a safe space, free of the influences of drugs, where at-risk youth can thrive, grow, and develop.

Not only is the mission of the NBCRC's Sponsored Youth Program important, but the variety of programming offered is also noteworthy. The NBCRC offers scholarships for Youth Soccer, Youth Developmental Basketball, Kinder-sports, and Little Kickers, allowing for a wide range of interests and opportunities for youth to flourish.

Youth sports programming is crucial for fostering physical health, social skills, and character development in young individuals. Through participation, children learn teamwork, discipline,

and resilience, setting a foundation for success in various aspects of life. This, as well as the friendships that are formed, contribute to the overall well-being and personal growth of youth.

In essence, the NBCRC's Sponsored Youth Program is more than just a recreational outlet, as it embodies a commitment to community enrichment. The program strives to nurture the aspirations of young individuals, and volunteers who help out are always welcomed as one way to partner with them.

The main requirement to volunteer with the NBCRC in their programming is providing the necessary Child Abuse Clearances and background checks.
