# Young Life of Central PA Young Life Camp

For over 50 years, Young Life of Central Pennsylvania has been involved in youth development in Blair County, offering programs for students in grades 6 through 12. By providing positive role models and engaging activities, Young Life aims to align with Operation Our Town's mission to prevent drug abuse and crime among adolescents. In today's challenging environment where teens face increasing pressures, the organization plays a critical role in fostering healthy choices and resilience.

Teenagers today are faced with undue stress and indifference, with many turning to unhealthy coping mechanisms like drug use. A 2019 Pew Research Center survey found that 51% of teens aged 13-17 view drug addiction as a major issue peers. among their Locally, the 2023 Pennsylvania Youth Survey (PAYS) revealed a concerning trend: among 12th graders in Blair County who vaped in the past year, 31.6% reported using marijuana or hash oil, a figure that has risen annually since 2015. Young Life counters these risks by connecting teens with mentors who model drug-free lifestyles. Research, such as a 2020 study by Erdem and suggests that mentorship significantly reduce substance use by fostering positive behaviors and beliefs.

Young Life's approach emphasizes meaningful activities to keep teens engaged and supported. The University of Michigan Health and American

Addiction Centers advocate for involvement in structured programs like sports, scouting, or faith-based groups to prevent substance abuse. Young Life's faith-based programs, including weekly events and its Young Life Camp, provide such opportunities. The camp offers exciting activities like ropes courses, water skiing, and climbing walls, creating potentially life-changing experiences that inspire teens to make wise choices. Many participants return as junior leaders, eager to positively influence their peers.

To ensure inclusivity, Young Life invites all teens to participate without requiring formal signups or membership. With camp costs rising, approximately 75% of students require financial assistance. Young Life of Central Pennsylvania remains committed to empowering youth, fostering resilience, and building a brighter future through mentorship, faith, and community.
